

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
BROUSSARD, LOUISIANA, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO
EXECTUE AN ACT OF ABANDONMENT OF AND REVOCATION OF
THE DEDICA TION OF CHARLES LANGLINAIS LANE**

The City Council of the City of Broussard, Louisiana, meeting in regular session on May 13, 2025, and, after due deliberation and discussion, and finding that it would be in the best interest of the City of Broussard, Louisiana, and its citizens, adopted the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, Charles Langlinais Lane (formerly Bercegeay Lane) is a roadway running westerly from U.S. Highway 90 in Lafayette Parish which does not connect with any other public roadway; and

WHEREAS, the City of Broussard acquired certain property along the southern boundary of Charles Langlinais Lane which property houses several the Broussard Police Department, the Broussard Fire Department, and the Broussard Public Works Department as well as other City offices; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Broussard has determined that for security reasons, access to Charles Langlinais Lane should be limited; and

WHEREAS, there are only three other owners of property bordering Charles Langlinais Lane on its northern and southern boundaries who have legitimate reasons for use of said roadway; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that Charles Langlinais Lane is no longer needed for public use; and

WHEREAS, conditioned on an agreement with other owners of property bordering the north and boundaries of Charles Langlinais Lane, the City desires to revoke the dedication of

Charles Langlinais Lane pursuant to the authority granted to it pursuant to La. R. S. 48:701.

THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Broussard finds that Charles Langlinais Lane is no longer needed for public use; and



SECTION 2: The attached estimates of Expenditures by departments for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2025, to be and the same is hereby adopted to serve as a budget of Expenditures for the City of Broussard during the same period.

An ordinance adopting an Operating Budget of Revenues and expenditures for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026. See attached Budget FYE 06/30/2025.

BE IT ORDANED BY THE BROUSSARD CITY COUNCIL OF City of Broussard, Louisiana in general session convened that:

SECTION 1: The attached detailed estimate of Revenues for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026, be and the same hereby adopted to serve as an Operation Budget of Revenues for the City for Broussard, during the same period.

SECTION 2: The attached estimates of Expenditures by departments for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026, be and the same is hereby adopted to serve as a budget of Expenditures for the City of Broussard during the same period.

SECTION 3: The adoption of this Operating Budget of Expenditures be and the same is hereby declared to operate as an appropriation of the amount therein set forth within the terms of the budget classification.

SECTION 4: Amounts are available for expenditures only to the extent included with the 2025-2026 budget.

SECTION 5: The Mayor of the City of Broussard shall have the authority to make changes within each department's operating budget to the extent that the department's total budget allocation is not modified without approval by the governing authority (City Council). Modifications which change a department's total budget allocation must be approved by the City Council. Additionally, all modifications to budgeted capital outlay must be approved by the City Council.
