3.5 BOARD: Discussion and/or action to take Ovey Comeaux High School offline for the 2026-27 and Repurpose the Campus - Mason/Labue 20
Ovey Comeaux High School will be taken offline at the end of the 2025-2026 Academic School Year in anticipation of renovations for the new academy. The Navy JROTC Magnet Academy Program will be relocated to Acadiana High School. Ovey Comeaux HS facility will be repurposed and renovated to accommodate the W.D. & Mary Baker Smith Career Center and E.J. Sam Accelerated School with the anticipation to service students no later than the 2028-2029 Academic School Year. The existing sports facilities will be repurposed and renovated to create the Lafayette Parish Schools Sports Complex, a centralized sports complex in Lafayette Parish for Lafayette Parish schools. Ovey Comeaux High School will be renamed Ovey Comeaux Workforce Innovation Academy

Please note by taking Ovey Comeaux High School offline, the District's General Fund would have an estimated cost savings of \$2,069,976.

NAMING OF FACILITIES

The Lafayette Parish School Board believes naming a school is a matter of great importance. The School Board shall not be influenced in its decision by personal prejudice or favoritism, political pressure, or temporary popularity in choosing a name. No school, school building, or other public building shall be named after any living person. However, a street that is maintained by the School Board and that is not a state or federal highway or any existing athletic facilities at a school within the School Board's jurisdiction may be named in honor of a living person.

The Superintendent shall be responsible for soliciting names from staff, students, and the community and shall prepare procedures to follow in naming or renaming school properties. These procedures may include a timetable for the naming process in order to lessen any community or factional pressures that may build up when a selection is delayed or seems uncertain.

2025-2026 LPSS DRESS CODE GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

In accordance with **La. R.S. 17:416.7**, the Lafayette Parish School Board has adopted a standard dress code as described below. The guidelines are designed to:

- Promote school safety
- Minimize distractions and disruptions based on personal appearance, grooming, hygiene, and attire.
- Prevent clothing, jewelry, and general appearance that are health or safety hazards.
- Prevent clothing styles that are suggestive, indecent, or inappropriately fitted.
- Foster an attitude of respect for authority, improve morale, and prepare students to enter a workforce that often has rules regarding dress, conduct, and appearance.

When it is determined that a student's clothing does not comply with the dress code, a parent/legal guardian shall be asked to bring an appropriate change of clothes to school. While awaiting the change of clothes, the student may be required to (a) wait in the office; (b) attend ISS; (c) go to class; or (d) any other option deemed necessary or appropriate by an administrator. Those who fail to comply or repeatedly violate the district dress code shall be subject to disciplinary action. Clarification regarding the discipline for improper dress should be directed to the school administrator.

VERIFY UNIFORMS

Parents should not rely on stores for information regarding Lafayette Parish uniform policy. If a parent is uncertain, please refer to the district or your child's school website before purchasing.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

Fit-

- A student's clothing should not be excessively tight or large.
- Parents should buy clothing that fits appropriately and can be worn without exposing undergarments.
- Clothing should have no exaggerated fit, which would promote sagging.
- Clothes so small that mid-drifts are exposed are not allowed.

Style-

- A student's clothing should be free from holes, frayed edges, or tears.
- Clothing should not be see-through.

Content-

- No clothing should contain anything that would be offensive in nature to any population of students. Clothing may not promote anything LPSS discipline policy prohibits (tobacco, alcohol, drugs, and violence).
- Clothing or grooming that is distracting to the educational environment will not be permitted.

School Spirit Attire-

- All clothing worn must represent the school the student is currently enrolled in and attending.
- Students may not wear clothing from any other public, private, or parochial school.
- Students can purchase and wear school-issued and designated school spirit attire (t-shirts) instead of the standard uniform polo shirt as a student option for daily wear (Monday-Friday).
- Schools may sell hoodless school spirit attire garments to be worn over uniforms or spirit shirts.

Final Decision-

- The Principal or their designee shall have the final decision on all dress code regulations, appropriate fit, and style within the established guidelines as approved by the Board.

PRINCIPAL'S DISCRETION TO MAKE UNIFORM EXCEPTIONS

Principals may declare spirit days and allow students to wear school spirit shirts or dress-up days (such as when school pictures are scheduled). Principals may determine guidelines for belts and the tucking of shirts. Principals may also allow students to wear other uniforms such as Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, band, chorus, etc. Additional questions about uniforms should be referred first to the school principal. The superintendent must approve special dress days, where fundraising monies are collected.

DRESS CODE IN SPECIAL CLASSES

Students must follow the rules of appropriate dress as dictated by the needs of special classes (i.e., physical education, industrial arts, consumer science, etc.)

EXCEPTIONS FOR RELIGIOUS REASONS

Requests for religious exceptions to the dress code must be made to the Office of Child Welfare & Attendance, which will explore the basis for the exception and determine if the exception is warranted. An individual requesting an exception bears the burden of demonstrating the following:

- The individual's legitimate religious belief conflicts with the Lafayette Parish School System student dress code.
- The dress or grooming of the student is a documented expression of their religious belief.
- The dress or grooming beliefs are rooted in religion and required by their religious practice.
- The individual has sincerely held the belief that enforcement of the student dress code will have a coercive effect that will operate to prevent their exercise of those religious beliefs.

Any student requesting an exception from the student uniform dress code for religious reasons must produce to the Office of Child Welfare and Attendance documentation establishing the legitimate existence of the religion and evidence of the grooming or dress as rooted in religion and as necessary while in school. The Office of Child Welfare and Attendance may deny a request if, in their judgment, the requested exception poses a danger to the student requesting the exception or to any student attending school in the system. All requests for exceptions must be made prior to any actions that would otherwise be a violation of the student uniform dress code.

IDENTIFICATION

School IDs must always be visible while on campus, with the picture facing outward. They must be worn on a lanyard around the neck or clipped to the shirt collar. IDs must have the national suicide hotline phone number “988” printed on them in accordance with **La. R.S. 17:282.4**. Photos may not be covered or defaced to prevent identification.

INSIGNIA

Any combination of clothing and jewelry that law enforcement agencies currently consider gang-related is not permitted. Discriminatory, obscene, or drug/alcohol related emblems, logos, symbols, jewelry signs, speech, or literature that is discriminatory, inflammatory, or derogatory toward any sex, race, nationality, creed, political or philosophical group, is obscene or contains profanity, or makes reference to drugs, alcohol, and tobacco are not permitted.

Sweatpants may be worn, at the discretion of the Superintendent, when extenuating weather circumstances arise. The Superintendent will make the determination of such extenuating weather circumstances where sweatpants are allowable.

2026-2027 LPSS DRESS CODE GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

In accordance with La. R.S. 17:416.7, the Lafayette Parish School Board has adopted a standard dress code as described below. The guidelines are designed to:

- Promote school safety
- Minimize distractions and disruptions based on personal appearance, grooming, hygiene, and attire.
- Prevent clothing, jewelry, and general appearance that are health or safety hazards.
- Prevent clothing styles that are suggestive, indecent, or inappropriately fitted.
- Foster an attitude of respect for authority, improve morale, and prepare students to enter a workforce that often has rules regarding dress, conduct, and appearance.

When it is determined that a student's clothing does not comply with the dress code, a parent/legal guardian shall be asked to bring an appropriate change of clothes to school. While awaiting the change of clothes, the student may be required to (a) wait in the office; (b) attend ISS; (c) go to class; or (d) any other option deemed necessary or appropriate by an administrator. Those who fail to comply or repeatedly violate the district dress code shall be subject to disciplinary action. Clarification regarding the discipline for improper dress should be directed to the school administrator.

VERIFY UNIFORMS

Parents should not rely on stores for information regarding Lafayette Parish uniform policy. If a parent is uncertain, please refer to the district or your child's school website before purchasing.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

Fit-

- A student's clothing should not be excessively tight or large.
- Parents should buy clothing that fits appropriately and can be worn without exposing undergarments.
- Clothing should have no exaggerated fit, which would promote sagging.
- Clothes so small or **modified** that mid-drifts are exposed are not allowed.

Style-

- A student's clothing should be free from holes, frayed edges, or tears.
- Clothing should not be see-through.

Content-

- No clothing should contain anything that would be offensive in nature to any population of students. Clothing may not promote anything LPSS discipline policy prohibits (tobacco, alcohol, drugs, and violence).
- Clothing or grooming that is distracting to the educational environment will not be permitted.

School Spirit Attire-

- All clothing worn must represent the school the student is currently enrolled in and attending.
- Students may not wear clothing from any other public, private, or parochial school.
- Students can purchase and wear school-issued and designated school spirit attire (t-shirts) instead of the standard uniform polo shirt as a student option for daily wear (Monday-Friday).
- **Only Elementary Schools may sell hooded** school spirit attire garments to be worn over uniforms or spirit shirts.

Final Decision-

- The Principal or their designee shall have the final decision on all dress code regulations, appropriate fit, and style within the established guidelines as approved by the Board.

PRINCIPAL'S DISCRETION TO MAKE UNIFORM EXCEPTIONS

Principals may declare spirit days and allow students to wear school spirit shirts or dress-up days (such as when school pictures are scheduled). Principals may determine guidelines for belts and the tucking of shirts. Principals may also allow students to wear other uniforms such as Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, band, chorus, etc. Additional questions about uniforms should be referred first to the school principal. The superintendent must approve special dress days, where fundraising monies are collected.

DRESS CODE IN SPECIAL CLASSES

Students must follow the rules of appropriate dress as dictated by the needs of special classes (i.e., physical education, industrial arts, consumer science, etc.)

EXCEPTIONS FOR RELIGIOUS REASONS

Requests for religious exceptions to the dress code must be made to the Office of Child Welfare & Attendance, which will explore the basis for the exception and determine if the exception is warranted. An individual requesting an exception bears the burden of demonstrating the following:

- The individual's legitimate religious belief conflicts with the Lafayette Parish School System student dress code.
- The dress or grooming of the student is a documented expression of their religious belief.
- The dress or grooming beliefs are rooted in religion and required by their religious practice.
- The individual has sincerely held the belief that enforcement of the student dress code will have a coercive effect that will operate to prevent their exercise of those religious beliefs.

Any student requesting an exception from the student uniform dress code for religious reasons must produce to the Office of Child Welfare and Attendance documentation establishing the legitimate existence of the religion and evidence of the grooming or dress as rooted in religion and as necessary while in school. The Office of Child Welfare and Attendance may deny a request if, in their

judgment, the requested exception poses a danger to the student requesting the exception or to any student attending school in the system. All requests for exceptions must be made prior to any actions that would otherwise be a violation of the student uniform dress code.

IDENTIFICATION

School IDs must always be visible while on campus, with the picture facing outward. They must be worn on a lanyard around the neck or clipped to the shirt collar. IDs must have the national suicide hotline phone number “988” printed on them in accordance with **La. R.S. 17:282.4**. Photos may not be covered or defaced to prevent identification.

INSIGNIA

Any combination of clothing and jewelry that law enforcement agencies currently consider gang-related is not permitted. Discriminatory, obscene, or drug/alcohol related emblems, logos, symbols, jewelry signs, speech, or literature that is discriminatory, inflammatory, or derogatory toward any sex, race, nationality, creed, political or philosophical group, is obscene or contains profanity, or makes reference to drugs, alcohol, and tobacco are not permitted.

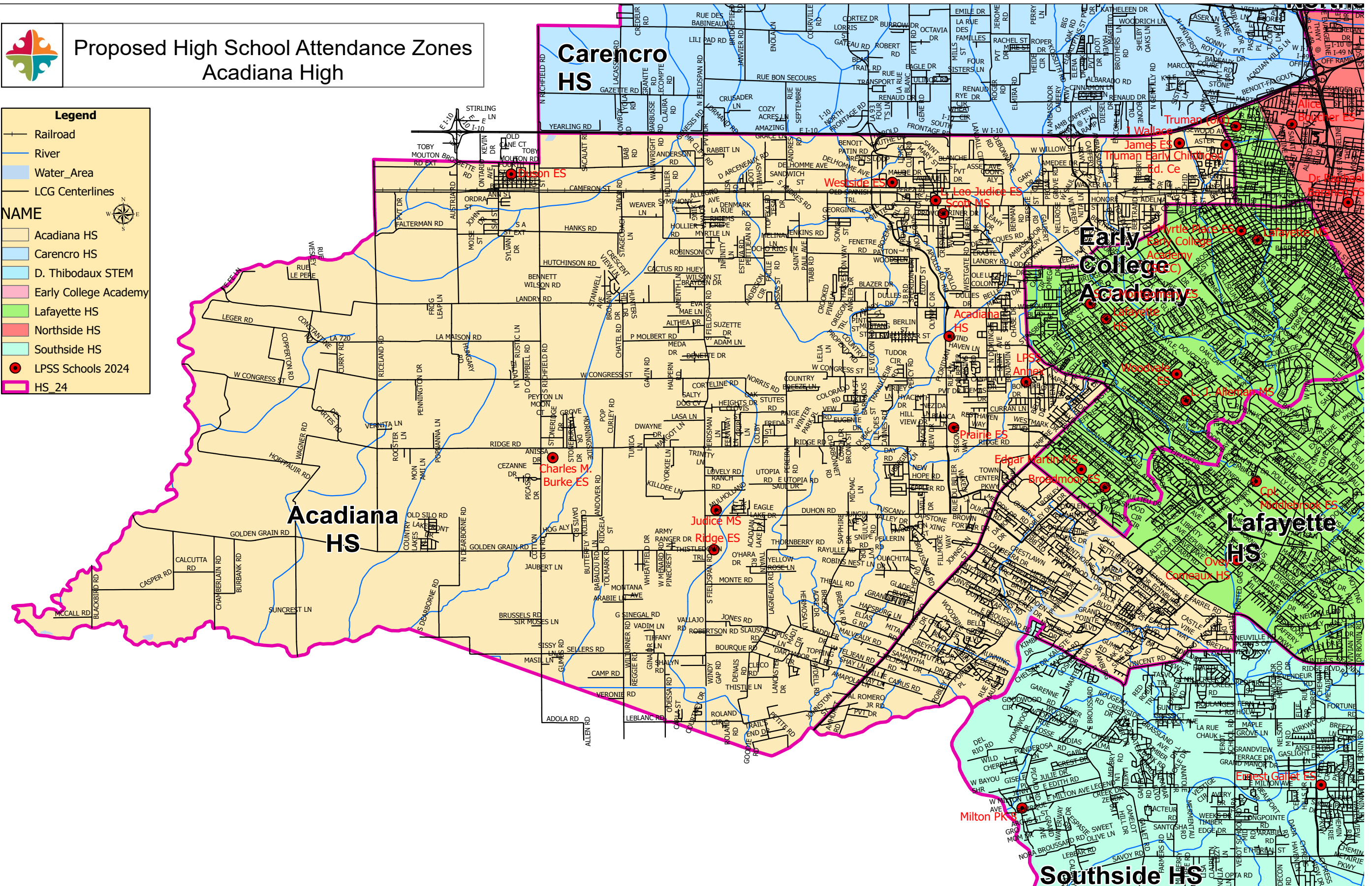
Proposed High School Attendance Zones Acadiana High

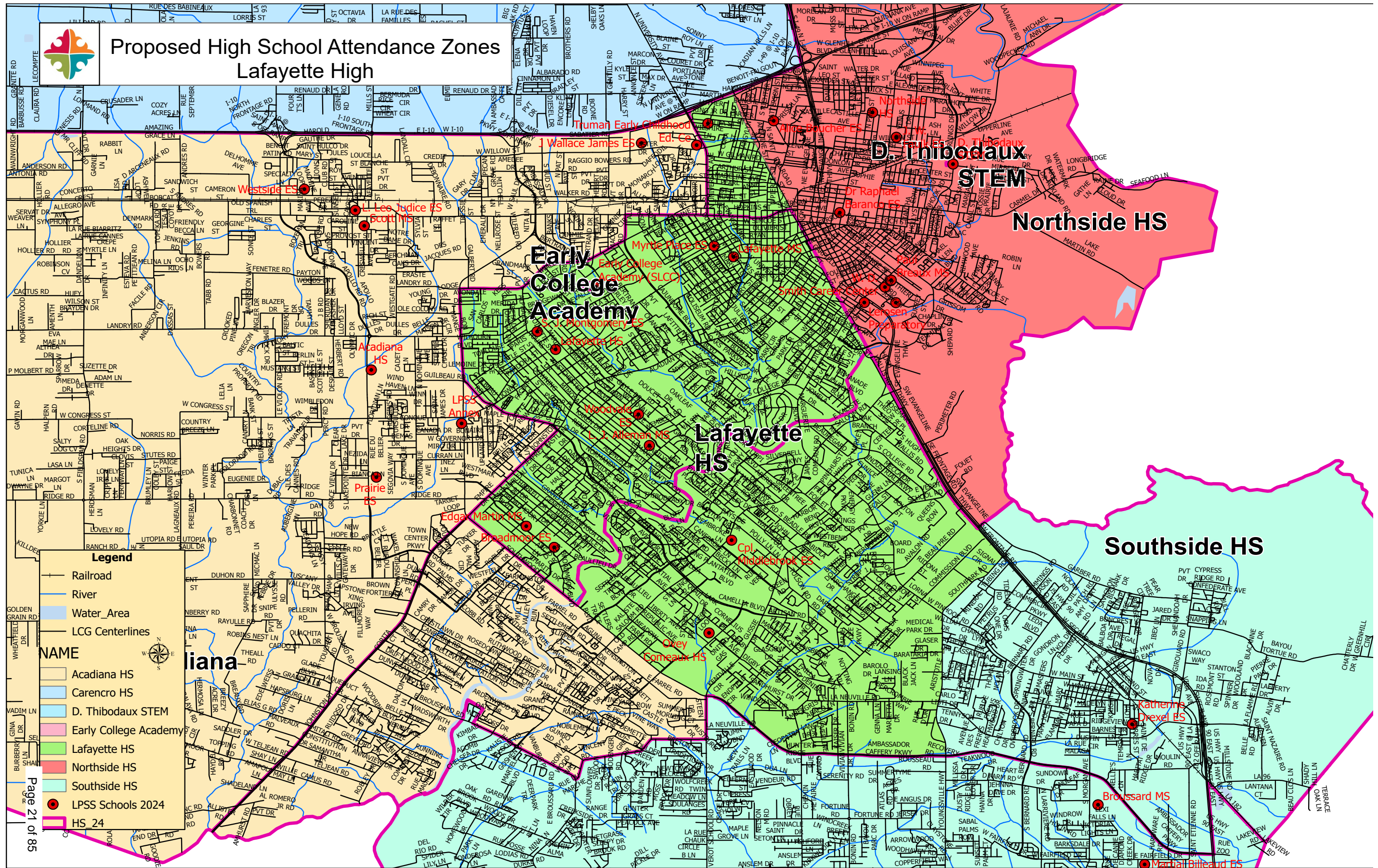

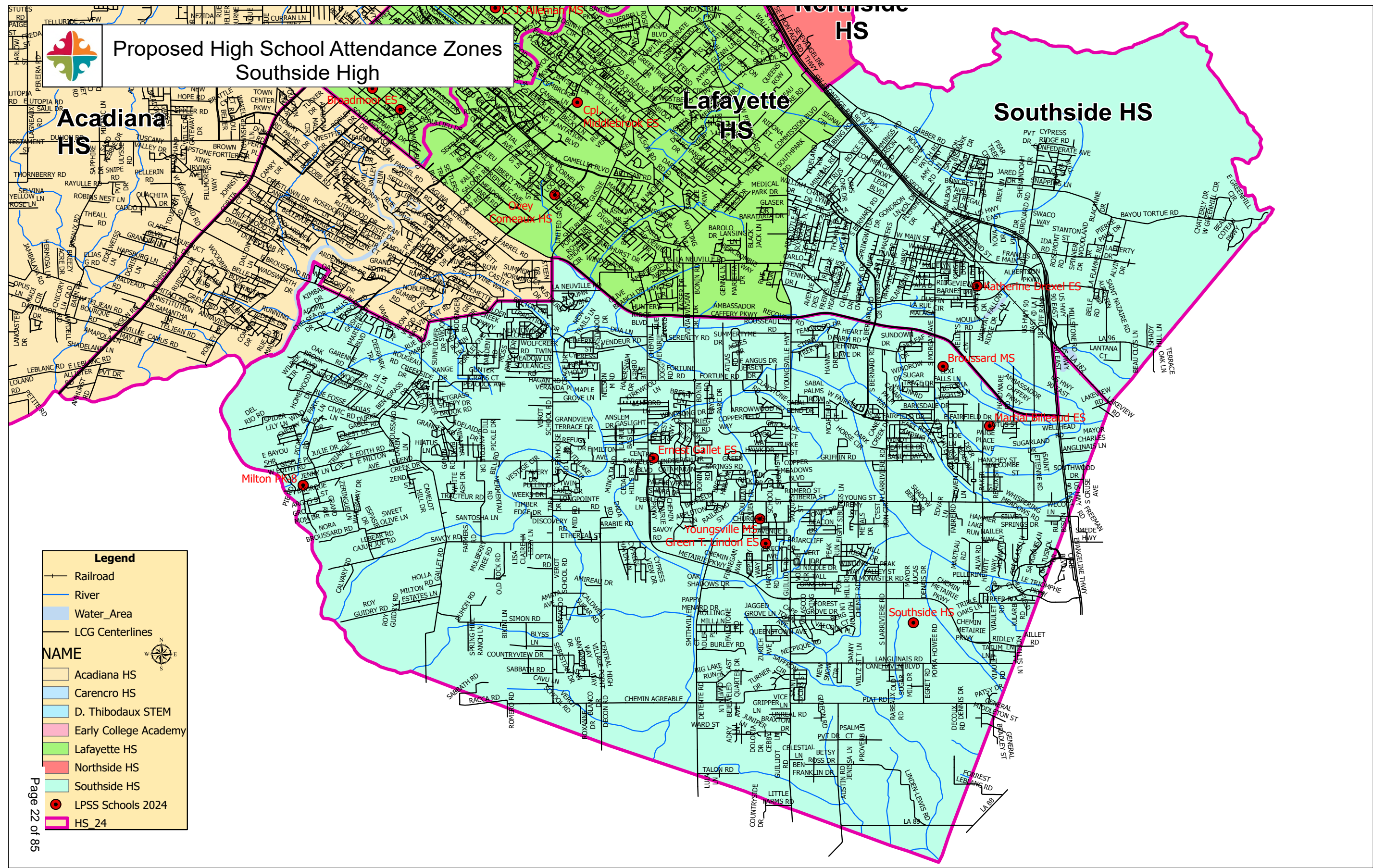

COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT

THIS COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"), is made and entered into on the Effective Date (as defined hereinbelow), by and between the CITY OF LAFAYETTE, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, represented herein by Monique B. Boulet, its Mayor-President, whose mailing address is P. O. Box 4017-C, Lafayette, Louisiana 70502-4017, duly authorized by Ordinance No. CO-011-2026 and Resolution No. CR-____-2026 (hereinafter referred to as the "City"), and the LAFAYETTE PARISH SCHOOL BOARD, a body corporate, represented herein by Francis Touchet, Jr., its Superintendent, whose mailing address is 202 Rue Iberville, Lafayette, Louisiana 70508 (hereinafter referred to as the "School Board").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14(C) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana provides that "For a public purpose, the state and its political subdivisions...may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other, with the United States or its agencies, or with any public or private association, corporation, or individual;" and

WHEREAS, the School Board is in the process of completing the renovations and construction of the new school campus for Lafayette High School (hereinafter referred to as the "LHS Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, as part of the LHS Improvements some of the existing sidewalks located on the campus will be demolished and reconstructed; and

WHEREAS, there exists a sidewalk that runs along West Congress Street from Marie Antionette Street to Foreman Drive (hereinafter referred to as the "Congress Sidewalk"), which, under the current design of the LHS Improvements, will be demolished, in part, and reconstructed for functional purposes consistent with the newly reconstructed LHS Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City desires that the Congress Sidewalk be not only functional, but also a vibrant and esthetically pleasing urban design that complements the newly renovated school campus and the community's unique identity (hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to assist the School Board financially with the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City has the authority to enter into this Agreement as evidenced by its governmental purpose of supporting or enhancing education and cultural and artistic development; and

WHEREAS, the public purpose of the Project is to provide a rich and dynamic visual, cultural and artistic experience that complements the reconstruction and modernization of the LHS Improvements, which will improve academic performance and booster teacher recruitment and retention while providing an effective learning environment, fostering community engagement, and increasing property values in the City of Lafayette; and

WHEREAS, the City has a reasonable expectation of receiving a benefit or value that is at least equivalent to or greater than the consideration described in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the transfer or expenditure of public funds or property is not a gratuitous donation.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree, as follows:

Agreement

The School Board does hereby agree to perform all acts necessary for the construction and installation of the Project, including, but not limited to, all engineering, designing, drafting, surveying, testing and inspecting in connection therewith. The development of the plans and specifications shall be performed in accordance with the City's requirements and specifications as specifically set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and no additional standards or requirements shall apply unless agreed to in writing by both parties.

The City hereby agrees to pay the School Board One Hundred Eighty-eight Thousand Three Hundred and No/100 (\$188,300.00) Dollars towards the costs of the Project (hereinafter referred to as the "Project Funding"). In consideration of the Project Funding, the School Board shall contract with the architect and general contractor of the LHS Improvements for the construction, installation and completion of the Project.

The School Board hereby acknowledges and agrees that the design of the Congress Sidewalk is subject to the City's reasonable approval.

Payment Terms

The parties agree that the Project Funding shall be paid monthly based upon the work performed on the Project to date. The School Board shall invoice the City monthly for the work performed on the Project to date. The City shall pay the School Board within thirty (30) days of receipt of the invoice.

Termination for Cause

The City may terminate this Agreement for cause based upon the failure of the School Board to comply with the terms and/or conditions of the Agreement; provided, however, that the City shall give the School Board written notice specifying the School Board's failure. If, within thirty (30) days after receipt of such notice, the School Board shall not have either corrected such failure or, in the case of failure which cannot be corrected in thirty (30) days, begun in good faith and thereafter proceeded diligently to complete such correction, then the City may, at its option, place the School Board in default and this Agreement shall terminate on the date specified in such notice.

Indemnification

The City shall, at its expense, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the School Board and its officials, employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, insurers and insureds, of and from all actual, potential or claimed liability or strict liability, demands, claims, differences, causes of action, rights of action and/or other disputes which arise out of any acts, omissions, negligence or fault of the City, or of any of their officials, employees, officers, agents, contractors or sub-contractors resulting from, or arising out of this Agreement.

The School Board shall, at its expense, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the the City and its officials, employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, insurers and insureds, of and from all actual, potential or claimed liability or strict liability, demands, claims, differences, causes of action, rights of action and/or other disputes which arise out of any acts, omissions, negligence or fault of the School Board or of any of its officials, employees, officers, agents, contractors or sub-contractors resulting from, or arising out of this Agreement.

Nonassignability

The School Board shall not in any manner or form transfer or assign any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the City.

Term of Contract

The effective date of this Agreement shall be on the date on which the last signing party has affixed its signature hereto (herein referred to as the "Effective Date") and the termination date shall be when the Project has been completed and all payments have been made hereunder. Until such time, this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

Entire Agreement

This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. All prior agreements or understandings between the parties concerning the Congress Sidewalk and/or the Project, whether written or oral, are merged into this Agreement and shall have no force and effect.

Non-Appropriation

The continuation of this Agreement is contingent upon the appropriation of funds to fulfill the requirements of the Agreement by the City Council. If the City Council fails to appropriate sufficient monies to provide for the continuation of the Agreement, or if such appropriation is reduced by the veto of the Mayor-President or by any means provided in the appropriations act to prevent the total appropriation for the year from exceeding revenues for that year, or for any other lawful purpose, and the effect of such reduction is to provide insufficient monies for the continuation of the Agreement, the Agreement shall terminate on the date of the beginning of the first fiscal year for which funds are not appropriated.

Budgeted Funds

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Agreement, the parties agree that the maximum amount payable under the Agreement shall be that which is the amount budgeted by the City for said Agreement. In the event the total amount of this Agreement is increased by reason of additional quantities or any other reason, so as to exceed the amount budgeted, the parties agree that the City shall not be liable for the amount of such increase until and unless said budget is amended pursuant to those provisions of law which govern the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government's budgetary process, to include the allowance for such an increase in funding.

All notices called for or contemplated hereunder shall be in writing and shall be given by personal delivery or by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid and addressed as set forth below:

Records

The School Board shall maintain all necessary books, documents, papers, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to the costs incurred relative to the Project and shall keep all materials available for inspection at all reasonable times. All such books and records shall be maintained by the School Board and will be open for inspection by the School Board and copies

thereof shall be furnished to the City upon request at the City's cost. The School Board shall be the custodian of such books and records as contemplated by La. R.S 44:1, et seq.

Responsibility After Construction

The parties acknowledge and agree that the City maintains a servitude along Congress Street, which servitude has allowed the City to install, maintain, and repair its sidewalks running along said street. The parties agree that upon the completion of the Project, the City shall take reasonable measures, within thirty (30) calendar days of receiving notice of completion of the Project from the School Board, to inspect the Project for compliance with the plans and specifications. If the Project is in compliance with the plans and specifications and all other City standards, specifications and requirements, the City shall issue a final acceptance of the Project. Upon completion and final acceptance of the Project, the School Board shall grant to the City any additional servitude, to the extent necessary, for all upkeep, maintenance and repair on the newly constructed portions of the Congress Sidewalk, and the City shall be responsible for the upkeep, maintenance and repair of the Congress Sidewalk, as renovated. The parties acknowledge that the School Board has no responsibility for the future inspection, repair, or maintenance of the City's sidewalks.

Counterpart

This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, with each counterpart being deemed an original and all counter parts being considered one and the same instrument.

Survival

The statements, representations, indemnifications and warranties made by the parties to this Agreement shall survive the term of this Agreement.

AUTHORIZED SIGNATURES

The Lafayette Parish School Board shall require, in accordance with state law, the School Board President and Superintendent, as secretary-treasurer, the Vice-President in the absence of the President, or any two (2) officers or persons designated by the School Board, to review all expenditures and sign any and all checks issued in payment of said expenditures. The signature of the Superintendent only is required on individual payroll checks. ELECTRONIC SIGNATURES

Electronic signature means an electronic sound, symbol, or process attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record. Electronic signatures or digital signatures can take many forms and can be created using many different types of technology. For the purpose of this policy an electronic signature means any electronic identifier intended by the person using it to have the same force and effect as a manual signature.

Lafayette Parish School Board Use of Electronic Signatures

When not practical or possible to have an approved individual physically sign a document, and not otherwise prohibited by applicable laws, electronic signatures may satisfy the requirement of a written signature when transacting business with and/or for the School District and/or with parents/guardians when the authenticity and reliability of such electronic signature(s) meets the provisions of this policy. In such instances, the electronic signature shall have the full force and effect of a manual signature.

In order to qualify for acceptance of an electronic signature the following additional requirements are applicable:

1. The electronic signature identifies the individual signing the document by his/her name and title;
2. The identity of the individual signing the document with an electronic signature is capable of being validated through the use of an audit trail;
3. The electronic signature, as well as the documents to which it is affixed, cannot be altered once the electronic signature is affixed. If the document needs to be altered, a new electronic signature must be obtained; and
4. The electronic signature conforms to all other provisions of this policy. The School District shall maintain School District electronically signed records in a manner consistent with the School District's document retention policies yet also capable of accurate and complete reproduction of the electronic records and signatures in their original form. Such retention should include a process whereby the School District can verify the attribution of a signature to a specific individual, detect changes or errors in the information contained in the record submitted electronically and protect and prevent access and/or manipulation or access/use by an unauthorized person.

CONTRACT OF LEASE

THIS LEASE made and entered into this 14th day of June 2018, between the LAFAYETTE PARISH SCHOOL BOARD herein represented by Erick Knezek, its President, hereinafter referred to as "LESSOR" and Monte Rosinski Farms, LLC, a limited liability company domiciled in Scott, Louisiana, whose permanent mailing address is 443 N. Richfield, Scott, LA 70583, hereinafter referred to as "LESSEE",

WITNESETH:

1. DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY. LESSOR hereby leases and lets to the LESSEE, under the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, the following described property, located in the Parish of Lafayette, State of Louisiana, to-wit:

Subject, nevertheless, to all highways, railroads and power lines crossing said premises or appearing of record, and to the right of LESSOR, its heirs, successors, assigns or the mineral leases thereof, to come upon said premises for the purpose of making geophysical surveys, erecting for, drilling for, producing and transporting oil, gas or other minerals, constructing roads, railroads, pipelines, communication lines, etc.

2. TERM. The term of this lease is seven (7) years, commencing on January 01, 2018, and ending at midnight on December 31, 2024. If LESSEE meets all contractual

December 31, 2027 = 


obligations in this lease, LESSEE will have the option to extend the term of this lease three (3) more years. Extension term shall commence on *January 01, 2025* and end at midnight on ~~December 31, 2028~~. This extension shall automatically occur unless LESSOR informs LESSEE of a failure to meet contractual obligations or LESSEE gives written notice of intent not to exercise extension option by March ^{31st} 2024.

3. RENTAL.

A. LESSEE agrees to pay LESSOR an annual cash rental of Eighty and 00/100 Dollars per farmable acre for land used for legal agricultural purposes, specifically the cultivation and harvesting of sugar cane. Farmable acres shall be determined using LESSEE's most recent insurance policy in effect covering said crops against damage or destruction. To verify acreage, LESSEE, on an annual basis, shall provide LESSOR a map clearly demonstrating all acreage currently in production. Failure to produce the map and/or plant crops on an otherwise farmable piece of land subject to this Lease shall not relieve LESSEE of its rent responsibilities to LESSOR. Rental shall be paid by January 31st of each year of the lease. All capital improvements will become the property of the LESSOR at the end of the lease.

B. The rent for the year January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018 shall be modified because the Lease Agreement was not signed until after May 21, 2018 nor has the tenant been given full possession of the property in order to begin farming operations. The rent for 2018 will be seventy-five percent (75%) of rent provided for in Paragraph 3(A), (75% of \$80.00 per farmable acre or \$60.00 per farmable acre).

4. USE OF PREMISES. LESSOR and LESSEE agree that LESSEE shall:

- A. Produce any legal agricultural crop, specifically sugar cane, on the leased property during the term of this contract;
- B. Excavate and remove debris, trees and brush as described in the LESSEE's response to the request for proposal (RFP) which will be done on a continuous basis throughout the term of this lease and any extension thereof;
- C. Laser level the site to assure proper drainage as proposed in the LESSEE's response to the RFP. Laser leveling of the site will be completed no later than the termination date of the initial term of the lease, December 31, 2024;
- D. Maintain all headlands and use application to prevent noxious weeds from growing on the property as proposed in LESSEE's response to the RFP;
- E. Add culverts and rock for loading site as proposed in the LESSEE's response to the RFP. However, culverts and rock for loading site proposed in LESSEE's response shall be considered "movable property" which LESSEE shall have the right to remove at the termination of this lease in accordance with Paragraphs 15

and 18 below.

5. PAYMENT FOR SEED AND STUBBLE CANE UPON CHANGE OF LESSEE.

A. Expiration of Term. Upon expiration of this Lease, including any extensions thereof, and a decision by LESSOR to enter into a separate lease agreement for the Property with a new lessee, LESSEE shall be entitled (1) to recover unrecovered planting costs only of any remaining crop through the third stubble, as determined by the Louisiana State University Agricultural Center, or (2) to complete the harvest of any in-place crops through the third stubble via subcontract agreement with the new lessee, subject to LESSEE matching the rental obligations of the new lease and LESSEE agreeing to peaceably surrender each tract of the Property to the new lessee once the in-place crop is harvested through the third stubble. Should LESSEE desire to complete the harvest of in-place crops, this option will be reflected in any bid documents issued by the LESSOR.

B. Non-Agricultural Use by LESSOR. In the event that the leased premises are taken from the LESSEE by the LESSOR and placed into non-agricultural uses, the LESSEE would be eligible for reimbursement for seed cane and stubble cane on the leased premises, according to the appraised value which shall be based on the Net Present Value of the unrealized future net revenue of the stubble with a crop cycle of no longer than third stubble, as determined by the Louisiana State University Agricultural Center.

6. DRAINAGE DITCHES AND CANALS. LESSOR hereby waives the right -to object to the construction, alteration or change in any drainage ditches or canals which may be made by LESSEE at its sole expense for the proper cultivation of said crops on the leased premises. LESSEE agrees that no such construction, alteration or change in any of said ditches or canals or the use thereof shall be made in such manner as to in any way adversely affect the rights which LESSOR has in any of said ditches or canals or which may be appurtenant to the leased premises, as regards the drainage of water through said ditches or canals over the property of others or adjoining or adjacent to said leased premises. If any changes are made in said ditches or canals by LESSEE,

LESSEE shall return the same to their original condition at the termination of this lease, at LESSOR'S option.

7. IRRIGATION OF RICE LANDS. In those areas where rice is planted and LESSOR has other property isolated or segregated from the irrigation source, LESSOR retains a right-of-way, not to exceed thirty (30) feet in width, along the property line of the premises herein leased to construct, use, and maintain, at its own expense, and irrigation

ditch or ditches to irrigate said isolated property.

8. CONDEMNATION. If the whole or a substantial part of the leased premises shall be taken by the right of eminent domain, or by voluntary transfer in lieu thereof, by any legal entity vested with the power of eminent domain, then when possession of the leased premises or any part hereof shall be taken by or title shall vest in such legal entity, whichever shall first occur, the term hereof and all rights of LESSEE hereunder shall immediately terminate and the rent shall be adjusted as of the time of such termination. LESSEE shall not be entitled to any part of the condemnation award or the consideration in lieu thereof received by LESSOR, except for crop and related damage. LESSEE may assert a claim against the legal entity exercising the right of eminent domain for crop damage and any other damages sustained as a result of the condemnation and the award of those damages shall belong to LESSEE.

9. INDEMNITY. LESSEE shall occupy the leased premises at its own risk and shall indemnify LESSOR against any expense, loss, cost, damage, claim, action or liability paid, suffered or incurred as a result of any breach by LESSEE, its agents, servants, employees, customers, visitors or licensees of any covenant or condition of this lease, including, without limitation, the provisions of paragraph 6 hereof relating to the rights of drainage from the leased premises over adjoining or adjacent property, or as a result of LESSEE'S use or occupancy of the leased premises or the carelessness, negligence, or improper conduct of LESSEE, its agents, servants, employees, customers, visitors, or licensees. The LESSEE'S liability under this lease extends to the acts of omissions of any subtenant and any agent, servant, employee, customer, visitor, or licensee of any such subtenant.

10. LESSOR'S RIGHT TO ENTER. LESSOR or his agents shall have the right at all times to enter the leased premises for the purpose of inspecting same or showing the same to prospective buyers or making repairs or improvements to the premises, but this shall place no obligation on LESSOR to make repairs.

11. CARE OF PROPERTY. The LESSEE binds and obligates himself to maintain the described property in an efficient manner in accordance with good and accepted practices; to commit no waste thereon; to properly ditch and drain the same; and to operate approved activities in accordance with good and accepted practices.

12. CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS. The construction of permanent improvements on the leased property is expressly prohibited, unless and until prior written approval therefore has been granted by the LESSOR. In the event that part of the consideration for the lease herein is the drilling and completion of a water well on the leased premises, then in that event, said water well shall become the property of the

LESSOR at the termination of the lease.

13. SUBLEASE OF PROPERTY. The subleasing of any part or all of the leased property is expressly prohibited, unless and until prior written approval thereof has been granted by the LESSOR.

14. TRANSFER OF CROP ALLOTMENT. The LESSEE shall not sell or transfer the right to any crop allotment accruing to the property without first obtaining written permission from the LESSOR.

15. CONDITION ON SURRENDER. LESSEE agrees that it will peaceably surrender the leased premises at the end of the term hereby granted in, as near as commercially possible, to the same good order and condition as the premises are at the commencement thereof.

16. WARRANTY. LESSOR warrants that it has the right to lease the property covered by this agreement and will defend LESSEE'S possession against any and all persons whomsoever. LESSEE binds and obligates himself to notify LESSOR immediately in writing of any adverse possession of the leased premises or of any adverse claim which may be asserted with respect to them.

17. POSSESSION PRIOR TO COMMENCEMENT OF TERM. If permission shall be given by LESSOR to LESSEE to enter into possession of the leased premises prior to the date herein fixed for the commencement of the term, such occupancy by LESSEE shall be deemed to be that of a tenant under all of the terms, covenants and conditions of this lease except as to the covenant to pay rent.

18. REMOVAL OF IMPROVEMENTS. All movable improvements (which both parties agree shall include the culverts and rock described in Paragraph 4(E) of this Lease Agreement) placed by LESSEE on the leased property with the written permission of LESSOR shall be removed prior to the termination of the lease. Any such improvements not so removed shall become the property of the LESSOR, without compensation to the LESSEE. Any costs incurred by the LESSOR due the cleaning or clearing of the property of improvements not removed shall be reimbursed to the LESSOR by the LESSEE.

19. DEFAULT: If LESSEE (a) fails to pay any installment of rent or to reimburse LESSOR for any sums paid by LESSOR for expenditures required of LESSEE due under this lease within fifteen (15) days after notice by LESSOR to LESSEE demanding same, provided that such notice need not be given with regard to nonpayment of rent after such notice has been given twice during the period of this lease; (b) fails to comply with any other provision of this lease within thirty (30) days after such notice by LESSOR; (c) if LESSEE abandons the leased premises, or for a period in excess of two (2) calendar months

discontinues the use of the leased premises for the purpose for which leased unless prevented from doing so by causes beyond LESSEE's control; (d) if LESSEE makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors or is adjudged as bankrupt in an involuntary bankruptcy proceeding or files any type of proceeding or applies for any relief under the laws of the United States relating to bankruptcy or State laws relating to insolvency or if a receiver or other custodian is appointed for LESSEE for any of **LESSEE's property** by any court; (e) if LESSEE fails for two (2) consecutive crop years to meet the Parish average in production of tons of sugar cane per acre, as determined by the United States Department of Agriculture, by twenty five percent (25%), then in any such events, LESSOR shall have the right, at LESSOR's option, without putting LESSEE in default and without notice to vacate, or notice of default: (1) to cancel this lease effective immediately or effective as of any date LESSOR may select, (2) to proceed one or more times for past due installments of rent or other cash obligations, without prejudicing the right to proceed later for additional installments or exercise any other remedy, (3) to declare the unpaid rent for the entire unexpired term of this lease immediately due and payable and at once demand and receive payment thereof, or (4) to have recourse to any other remedy or mode of redress to which LESSOR may be entitled by law. In the event LESSOR exercises the right to cancel this lease, then: (a) LESSOR shall have the right, as soon as said cancellation is effective, to re-let the same for such price and on such terms as may immediately available, without notice or court proceedings, LESSEE hereby assenting thereto and expressly waiving any notice to vacate, and (b) LESSEE shall be and remain liable not only for rent and other obligations payable to the date such cancellation becomes effective, but also for all damage or loss suffered by LESSOR for the remaining term of this lease resulting from such cancellation and the re-leasing on less favorable terms. Failure of LESSOR to exercise any right granted in this paragraph shall not be construed as a waiver of the right and no indulgence by LESSOR shall be construed as a waiver of any right herein granted. LESSOR's election of a remedy or right shall not be irrevocable; LESSOR may at any time change its selection or remedies. In any event, if LESSEE fails to pay any installment within ten (10) days from its due date, LESSEE shall owe unto LESSOR a late penalty equal to fifteen percent (15%) of the amount past due.

The LESSOR reserves the right to cancel this Lease should it determine that the land is needed for any purpose upon providing LESSEE ninety (90) days written notice, in which event the termination would be governed by Article 5(B) of this Lease.

20. ABANDONMENT OF LEASE. In the event that LESSEE does not properly maintain the site in accordance with customary practices of stated use of the property, the said lease shall be considered abandoned at the end of the then current lease year, and LESSEE will deliver full possession of the premises to LESSOR upon being given written notification by Registered Mail at least ten days prior to the end of the current lease year, and LESSEE shall be responsible for LESSOR'S damages as herein provided and the cost to bring the site back into a condition necessary to lease the site to another party.

21. DEPOSIT AND DAMAGES.

A. LESSEE shall deposit, at the time of the execution of this lease, the sum of TEN AND NO/ 100 DOLLARS (\$10.00) per acre for the land herein leased. The said deposit shall be held by LESSEE, interest free, during the entire term of the contract and, in the event of default in the payment of rent or the violation or failure to comply with any of the terms of the lease, the monies deposited shall be forfeited by the LESSEE as liquidated damages. In addition to said liquidated damages, the LESSEE shall be responsible for all further damages and losses sustained by LESSOR as a result of LESSEE'S breach of the contract.

B. Should an agent or attorney be employed to enforce or protect any claim of LESSOR arising from this lease, LESSEE shall pay all costs, charges and expenses, to include the reasonable fees to said agent or attorney, it being understood that the minimum fee shall be \$500.

C. Failure to strictly and promptly enforce any of LESSOR'S rights under this lease shall not operate as a waiver of LESSOR'S rights, LESSOR expressly reserving the right to always enforce prompt payment of rent or any other covenant or condition of this lease, or to cancel this lease, regardless of any indulgence or extension previously granted. The receiving by LESSOR of any rent in arrears, after notice of any suit for possession or for cancellation of this lease, shall not be considered as a waiver of such notice or suit or of any of the rights of LESSOR.

22. SUCCESSION. This lease shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, except where the lease has been transferred or assigned in violation of the terms hereof.

23. INSURANCE. (a) LESSEE, at its expense, shall at all times during the term maintain in full force and effect the following insurance policies to protect itself and LESSOR: (i) Comprehensive general liability and property damage insurance naming LESSOR as an additional insured and providing coverage for general liability, personal liability, and property damage, with a "broad form" endorsement that includes a contractual liability endorsement covering LESSEE's agreement to indemnify LESSOR as set out in this Lease, with minimum combined single limits for bodily injury and property damage of \$1.5 million per occurrence, or such other reasonable minimum limits as may be established from time to time by LESSOR.

24. ENVIRONMENTAL. LESSEE covenants and warrants that LESSEE's use of the leased premises and the use by any subtenant, assignee or other person or entity occupying or using the leased premises will at all time comply with and conform to all laws, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations of any governmental, quasi-governmental or regulatory authorities ("Laws") which relate to the transportation, storage,

placement, handling, treatment, discharge, generation, production or disposal (collectively, "Treatment") of any waste, petroleum product, waste products, radioactive waste, polychlorinated biphenyls, asbestos, hazardous materials of any kind, and any substance which is regulated by any law, statute ordinance, rule or regulation, including without limitation any substance defined as "hazardous waste" or hazardous substance" under Section 1004 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C.A. §§ 9601, et seq., or Section 101 of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, 42 U.S.C.A. § 9601 (collectively, "Waste"). LESSEE further covenants and warrants that it will not engage in or suffer or permit any person or entity to engage in any Treatment of any Waste on or which affects the leased premises.

Immediately upon receipt of any Notice (as hereinafter defined) from any person or entity, LESSEE shall deliver to LESSOR a true, correct and complete copy of any written Notice. "Notice" shall mean any note, notice or report of any suit, proceeding, investigation, order, consent order, injunction, writ, award or action related to or affecting or indicating the Treatment of any Waste in or affecting the leased premises.

LESSEE hereby agrees that it will indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless LESSOR and LESSOR's officers, directors, shareholders, employees, agents, partners, and their respective heirs, successors and assigns (collectively, "LESSOR Indemnified Parties") against and from, and to reimburse the LESSOR Indemnified Parties with respect to, any and all damages, claims, liabilities, losses, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, all attorneys' fees and expenses, court costs, administrative costs and costs of appeals), incurred by or asserted against the LESSOR Indemnified Parties by reason of or arising out of: (a) the breach of any representation or undertaking of LESSEE under this Section or (b) arising out of the Treatment of any Waste in or affecting the leased premises by LESSEE or any subtenant, assignee, licensee, concessionaire, manager or other party occupying or using the leased premises.

LESSOR is given the right, but not obligation, to inspect and monitor the leased premises and LESSEE's use of the leased premises in order to confirm LESSEE's compliance with the terms of this Section and the representations set forth in this Section. LESSOR may require that LESSEE deliver to LESSOR concurrent with LESSEE's vacating the leased premises upon the expiration of this lease, or any earlier vacation of the leased premises by LESSEE, at LESSEE's expense, a certified statement by licensed engineers satisfactory to LESSOR, in form and substance satisfactory to LESSOR, stating that LESSEE's use of the leased premises complied and confirmed to all Laws which relate to the Treatment of any Waste in or affecting the leased premises.

LESSEE agrees to deliver upon request from LESSOR estoppel certificates to LESSOR expressly stipulating whether LESSEE is engaging in or has engaged in the Treatment of any Waste in or affecting the leased premises, and whether LESSEE has caused any spill, contamination, discharge, leakage, release or escape of any Waste in or

affecting the leased premises, whether sudden or gradual, accidental or anticipated and whether, to the best of LESSEE' s knowledge, such an occurrence has otherwise occurred at or affecting the leased premises.

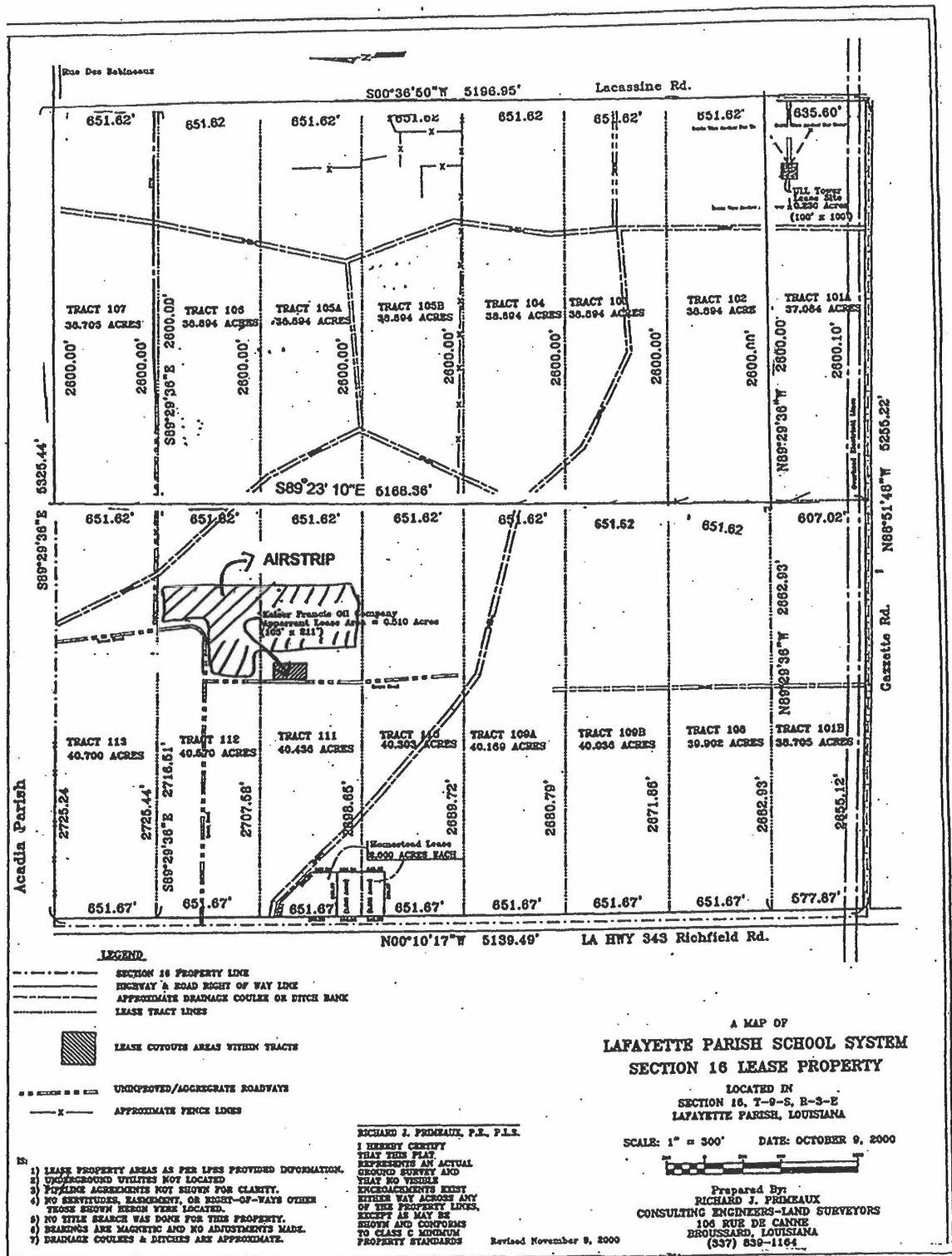

AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT OF LEASE

THIS AMENDMENT to Contract of Lease (the “Amendment”) is made and entered into effective March 12, 2026, by and between Lafayette Parish School Board, herein represented by Hannah Smith Mason, it’s duly authorized President, herein referred to as “Lessor” and Monte Rosinski Farms, LLC, a limited liability company domiciled in Scott, Louisiana, whose permanent mailing address is 443 N. Richfield, Scott, LA 70583, hereinafter referred to as “Lessee”.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Lessor and Lessee declared that they did enter into a Contract of Lease dated June 14, 2018, effective January 1, 2018 affecting Tracts 102, 103, 104, 105A, 105B (less approx.. 13.48 acres east of canal), 106 and 107, Section 16, Township 9 South, Range 3 East, Lafayette Parish, Louisiana for a total of approximately 269 acres, as depicted on the map attached to the Contract for Lease.

WHEREAS, Lessor and Lessee desire to amend the above referenced Contract of Lease in the following respects:

- (a) “Paragraph 2 Term.” Of the Contract of Lease, is hereby amended to read as follows, to wit:

The term of this lease is seventeen (17) years, commencing on January 1, 2018, and ending at midnight on December 31, 2034, or so long thereafter as may be required by Lessee to complete the harvesting of the 2034 crop. Prior to the expiration of this Lease, it is the responsibility of Lessee to successfully conclude negotiations with the successor, if any, the financial disposition on any crop in place.

- (b) “Paragraph 3. Rental” Of the Contract of Lease is hereby amended to read as follows, to wit:

A. Lessee agrees to pay Lessor an annual cash rental of One-Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$100.00) per farmable acre for land used for legal agricultural purposes, specifically the cultivation and harvesting of sugar cane. Farmable acres shall be determined using Lessee’s most recent insurance policy in effect covering said crops against damage or destruction. To verify acreage, Lessee, on an annual basis, shall provide Lessor a map clearly demonstrating all acreage currently in production. Failure to produce the map and/or plant crops on an otherwise farmable piece of land subject to this Lease shall not relieve Lessee of its rent responsibilities to Lessor. Rental shall be paid by January 31st of each year of the

lease. All capital improvements will become the property of the Lessor at the end of the lease.

In all other respects the Contract of Lease as amended herein shall remain the same.

Whereas, individuals who wish to access community mental health services often find such services unavailable, inaccessible, or inadequate;

Whereas, school-based mental health programs are critical to early identification of and early intervention for mental health problems;

Whereas, school social workers, being licensed mental health professionals in schools in the United States, provide necessary assessment, interventions, counseling, family outreach, and community referrals;

Whereas, school social workers maintain knowledge of school culture and school climate which are necessary for responsible school safety planning;
