4.2 Variance request #1 for Adley James and Aurie Grace Modern Living

Motion by Councilman Delahoussaye

Second by Councilwoman Girouard

Discussion: Mark Ste. Marie opened by thanking the mayor and council for the opportunity to speak. He explained that he hopes to build homes on his property to add value and support the growth of the downtown area. He described why he believes standalone tiny homes are the best fit for the site and noted that the project would require three variances. Although he stated that, in his opinion, the development would not negatively affect drainage, he also made clear that he did not want to obtain the drainage analysis from an engineer that is required under the city's ordinance. Trevor Ducote, owner of Passion Home Designs and the project's designer, told the council he was available to answer any questions. Mayor Bourque noted that the request included three variances. City Attorney Gerald advised the council that each variance would need to be considered and voted on individually. Mayor Bourque explained that the first variance request involved reducing the required right-of-way width from 60 feet to 40 feet. He noted that while historic Broussard typically has 40-foot right-of-way easements, the city's subdivision standards call for 60 feet, largely to accommodate modern needs such as safe open-ditch drainage. Walter added that the 60-foot standard helps prevent steep drop-offs along ditches. However, Mayor Bourque said that after discussing the matter with Mel and Walter, it appeared reasonable to consider a 40-foot easement in this case because the city has no plans to widen the road in that area, making the larger right-of-way unnecessary. Councilman Bonin asked Walter whether the right-of-way requirement would still apply if Mr. Ste. Marie were building only a single home on the property, and Walter confirmed that the requirement would remain the same. Trevor expressed that if only a single-family home were being built on the property, he believed that many of the current requirements would not apply, and that the need for variances arose solely because subdividing the land caused it to be classified as a subdivision under city regulations. Walter clarified that the property is indeed considered a subdivision but emphasized that the additional requirements being triggered are not solely subdivision rules and stated that several of the standards they must follow come from the Old Town Overlay District regulations, which apply regardless of the subdivision classification. Mayor Bourque asked the council if they would want to enforce the standard 60-foot requirement. Councilman Delahoussaye responded that he did not anticipate the city ever widening the road in this area and therefore moved to approve the variance, allowing the right-of-way to remain at 40 feet.

Discussion: Mayor Bourque explained that the second variance request involved reducing the required 15-foot sidewalk easement. He noted that Mr. Ste. Marie was asking to use the standard 10-foot easement instead of the 15-foot requirement on both streets of the corner lot. Walter clarified that the easement being discussed is not an enhanced or special requirement but rather the city's standard easement. He noted that while the regulations are written to apply citywide, some areas in the older parts of town may require different considerations due to their historic layout and existing conditions. Trevor noted that the expanded easement would only be necessary along the sides of the property. Councilman Delahoussaye moved to approve the variance and allow the 10-foot sidewalk easement.

Variance request #3 for Adley James and Aurie Grace Modern Living

Motion by Councilman Delahoussaye

Second by Councilwoman Girouard

Discussion: The third variance request was to waive the required drainage analysis. Trevor explained that the construction plan includes a 10-foot separation between each property so the land can be graded to direct water toward the ditches. Walter responded that Trevor must demonstrate this with an engineer's drainage analysis, which is required by Broussard's city ordinance. Walter also noted that he has never seen a variance granted on drainage requirements and he cannot recommend the waiver on a drainage analysis. Walter clarified that he is not requesting a full subdivision drainage analysis. Instead, he emphasized that this is a high-density area where homes will sit close to neighboring properties, and raising the building pads could create drainage challenges. He wants a licensed engineer to explain how water will move from the back of each lot to the front without causing problems. He also stated that the engineer's report must confirm that the proposed drainage plan will not negatively impact surrounding properties. Trevor raised concerns about the cost of obtaining the required drainage analysis. Councilman Delahoussaye then asked whether the homes would be equipped with gutters, and Mr. Ste. Marie responded that he would be willing to consider installing gutters on the houses. Councilman Bonin asked Mr. Ste. Marie to confirm that he had already added dirt and built up the lots, noting that this work has already altered drainage in the area. Councilman Bonin explained that once the houses

are built, runoff from the roofs will cause water to drain even faster, increasing the potential impact on neighboring properties. Because of this, he said he could not support waiving the drainage analysis. He agreed with Walter that a licensed engineer must provide a stamped report verifying that the project will not negatively affect the surrounding areas. Walter clarified that his only request is for a site grading plan along with a letter from a licensed engineer. He emphasized that these documents should explain how drainage will be handled and confirm that the proposed work will not negatively impact surrounding properties. Councilman Bonin noted that the city is currently working on a drainage project in this area to address existing problems, and he does not want to approve anything that could worsen the situation before those issues are resolved. Councilman Delahoussaye moved to approve the variance request to waive the drainage analysis.

Mrs. Desormeaux clarified that her request involves only a five-foot encroachment into the easement.

4.4 Condemnation update of 107 Loul Street

Emma Lee Washington & Kirk James Washington (Estate)

Ben reported that Ms. Washington has picked up her plan review and is now moving forward with obtaining her plumbing and electrical permits. He explained that she and her team are using a material supply list and have begun ordering what they need to complete the cosmetic upgrades required to bring the home back into compliance. He also noted that she contacted him earlier today with an update, and they are both continuing to stay in regular communication as the project progresses.

5.4 Resolution #893-26

A resolution to amend the 2025/2026 Operating Budget of Revenues and Expenditures to increase authorized expenditures for Water Sector Projects

Motion by Councilman Delahoussaye

Second by Councilman Regan

Discussion: Daniel provided an overview of the three projects included in the city's water sector grant. The first project involves installing a 12-inch water line along North Girouard Road that will connect to an existing line on Bayou Tortue Road, extend to the nearby industrial park, and tie into Highway 90, creating an additional loop for the Garber Road water facility. The second project focuses on adding generators to the booster pump station on Burgess Drive and to the Highway 90 water tower to support the wells located there. The third project consists of major improvements to the Garber Road water well, including constructing a new well, a ground water storage tank, and a booster pump station. Mayor Bourque asked for clarification on the total funding for the water sector grant, and Daniel confirmed that the grant provides \$3,710,000 with the city contributing \$1,735,550, bringing the total project funding to \$5,445,550. With this information, the mayor noted that the city is working under tight deadlines associated with grant requirements. Daniel explained that after the grant was approved, Comeaux Engineering had to design the projects, submit updated cost estimates to LDH for approval, then wait for the water sector's approval. Once that approval was received, the city had only 30 days to advertise the projects for bids. Walter noted that the projects will add roughly half a million gallons of additional water storage, which will greatly benefit the city during freezing events when residents leave faucets dripping. He explained that the goal is to have two days' worth of storage available in the tanks to better manage emergency situations. Councilman Bonin asked Daniel whether the planned improvements would help resolve the past issues with the Garber Road well. Daniel explained that the earlier problems occurred because water was being drawn from a lower zone. He said the city will drill a test well to sample water from all three zones including the upper zone, which hydrologists believe contains good-quality water similar to what is produced at the Polk Tower and may not require treatment. Mel added that the city has already reworked the existing well to address some issues, and the new project will allow the well to operate at a lower pumping rate, something they've learned maintains better water quality and prevents chlorides from surfacing. He noted that the improvements will also allow the city to blend water from both wells to produce

a higher-quality supply. Mayor Bourque explained that this resolution is necessary for the city to continue moving forward with the grant funding process.

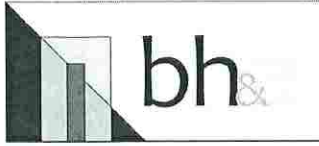

BE IT KNOWN, that, on the dates hereinafter set forth, before us, the undersigned authorities, Notaries Public, in and for the aforesaid Parish and State, duly commissioned and qualified as such and in the presence of the undersigned competent witnesses, respectfully came and appeared:

THE CITY OF YOUNGSVILLE, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, represented herein by its Mayor, Ken Ritter, duly authorized by Resolution No. 2025-02 adopted on the 13th day of February, 2025, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof (hereinafter referred to as "Youngsville"),

and

THE CITY OF BROUSSARD, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, represented herein by its Mayor, Ray Bourque, duly authorized by Resolution No. 895-26 adopted on the 14th day of April, 2026, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof (hereinafter referred to as "Broussard"),

and

COPLAN, LLC, a domestic limited liability corporation, represented herein by Steven Hebert, duly authorized by the attached _____ and having a physical address of 106 Saint Nazaire Rd., Louisiana, 70518, (hereinafter referred to as "Coplan"),

each of whom declared:

WHEREAS, Youngsville and Broussard each have responsibilities for the flow, road conditions and public safety into and out of their respective jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Transportation awarded Youngsville a \$3,034,575 grant through the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Program for the *Young Street Intersection Safety Improvements* project; and

WHEREAS, Youngsville is undertaking roadway improvements at S. Larriviere Rd and LA 92 by replacing the existing 4-way stop with a modern roundabout (hereinafter referred to as the “Project”), which Project shall greatly benefit the motoring public who travel, reside or work both within Youngsville and in Broussard; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the roadway to be improved is within the corporate limits of the City of Youngsville, and a portion is within the corporate limits of the City of Broussard, and accordingly, the officials of Youngsville and Broussard desire to share the costs and expenses associated with the proposed Project; and

WHEREAS, Coplan, LLC has committed to Youngsville and Broussard a land donation for the project; and

WHEREAS, Youngsville, Broussard and Coplan desire to enter into this Intergovernmental Cooperative Endeavor Agreement (hereinafter referred to as “Agreement”) to set forth each party’s responsibilities as to the Project; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14(C) of the 1974 Constitution of the State of Louisiana and LSA-R.S. 33:1324, et seq. provide that, for a public purpose, public entities, parishes, municipalities, and political subdivisions may engage in and make cooperative endeavor agreements/intergovernmental agreements between themselves for specific purposes.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants set forth herein, Youngsville, Broussard and Coplan do hereby agree and contract as follows:

1. **AGREEMENT**. Youngsville does hereby agree to construct and perform all acts necessary for construction of the Project, including, but not limited to, all engineering, designing, drafting, surveying, testing, and inspecting in connection therewith.

Youngsville shall advance the payment of all costs associated therewith, including, but not limited to, construction, engineering, design, drafting, surveying, testing, inspecting and all other professional services and the like necessary or appropriate for the planning or development of the Project.

2. DONATION BY COPLAN. By this Agreement, Coplan commits a land donation for the project of +/- 0.50 acres. This land donation will be applied towards the required twenty percent (20%) financial match.

3. REIMBURSEMENT BY BROUSSARD. By this Agreement, Broussard commits and obligates itself to pay twenty-five percent (25%) of the remaining required twenty percent (20%) financial match of the overall cost of the project after in-kind donations have been applied by Coplan. During the construction in connection with the Project, Broussard shall reimburse Youngsville over the course of the entire Project on a quarterly basis for Broussard's proportionate share of the commitment. Broussard shall remit such payment to Youngsville within thirty (30) days of receipt of such determination. Broussard reserves the right to review engineering plans, specifications, and related work items to verify completion levels, and to conduct such audits or financial investigations as it deems appropriate. Notwithstanding any other provision herein, the reimbursement due by the City of Broussard shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00).

4. RECORDS OF COSTS. Youngsville shall maintain all necessary books, documents, papers, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to the costs incurred relative to the Project and shall keep all materials available for inspection at all reasonable times. All such books and records shall be maintained by Youngsville and will be open for inspection by Broussard and Coplan and copies thereof shall be furnished to Broussard and Coplan upon request at Broussard or Coplan cost. Youngsville shall be the custodian of such books and records as contemplated by La. R.S 44:31, et seq.

5. EFFECTIVE DATE. The effective date of this Agreement shall be on the date on which the last signing has affixed its signature hereto and the termination date shall be when the Project has

been completed and all payments have been made hereunder. Until such time, this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

6. RESPONSIBILITY AFTER CONSTRUCTION. Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, upon the completion of the Project, Broussard shall be fully responsible for all maintenance, alteration, correction, improvement, and repair of all portions of N. Larriviere Road and Young Street within its jurisdiction and Youngville shall be responsible for the maintenance, alteration, correction, improvement, and repair of all portions of N. and S. Larriviere Road and Young Street within its jurisdiction.

7. PUBLIC PURPOSES. According to this Agreement, Youngville, Broussard and Coplan agree to obligate themselves to act under the terms and conditions contained herein solely for the public purposes set forth herein and in accordance with Article VII, Section 14(C) of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974 and/or La. R.S. 33: 1236, et seq., and the parties agree that this Agreement may be terminated immediately if it is determined that any of the activities undertaken herein are being used for any other purpose other than those specifically set forth herein.

8. NON-ASSIGNABILITY. This Agreement is strictly between Youngville, Broussard and Coplan, and no party has the right to assign this Agreement or any part hereof to any other party.

9. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties; all prior agreements between the parties, whether written or oral, are merged into this Agreement and shall have no force and effect.

10. NOTICES. All notices called for or contemplated hereunder shall be in writing and shall be given by personal delivery or by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid and addressed as set forth below:

AMENDMENT TO CONCESSION AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2017 the Bon Temps Concessions, LLC (BTC) entered into a Concession Agreement with the City of Broussard (City), and

WHEREAS, the Concession Agreement had an initial term which expired on April 30, 2023, and

WHEREAS the Concession Agreement was extended for one year which expires on April 30, 2024, and

WHEREAS, the parties have continued to operate under the terms of the expired Concession Agreement and wish to further extend the agreement as hereafter set forth.

The foregoing considered, the parties agree as follows:

1. In Section 2.1 the term City's Premises shall mean St. Julien Park and no other property owned or operated by the City.
2. BTC acknowledges that the City of Broussard has fully complied with Section 5.1 and Section 5.2. BTC accepts all existing equipment in its current condition. Any additional equipment needed or desired by BTC and any structural changes required by BTC shall be at the expense of BTC.
3. Section 5.3 of the Concession Agreement is hereby amended to provide that BTC shall be responsible for the cost of all cleaning supplies for housekeeping of the concession stands and condiment stands. Refuse shall be placed by BTC at a location reasonable designated by the City.

4. Section 5.4 of the Concession Agreement is amended to provide that BTC shall be responsible repairs and cost of repairs for damaged or broken fixtures and repairs and maintenance, and cost thereof, of equipment within the concession stands.
5. Section 6.1 is amended to provide that BTC shall pay the flat sum of \$7,500 per month for the rights and privileges granted to it under this agreement. Said amount shall be due on or before the 10th day of each month. Compensation shall no longer be computed as a percentage of sales. Notwithstanding the foregoing, BTC shall prepare and deliver to the City a report of Gross Revenues realized from BTC's operations under this agreement. Said report shall be due semi-annually on June 15th and December 15th and shall report on the previous 6 complete months. Failure to provide any report shall result in a late fee of \$100.00 for each 15 days or portion thereof.
6. In addition, the City is constructing or may construct a new concession stand for operation in connection with the new pickleball courts. Upon completion of the new concession stand, BTC shall assume operation of that concession stand and shall pay the City the additional sum of \$2500.00 per month which shall be due on or before the 10th day of each month.
7. The base annual rent shall be adjusted at the end of years 2, 4, and 6. Rental adjustment shall be based on changes in the consumer price index as published by the U.S Bureau of Labor Statistics between the date of this agreement and the date of rental adjustment. Rent shall not be increased or decreased by more than 10% of the annual rent paid during the preceding 2 years.

8. All rent and fees not timely paid shall bear interest at the rate of 1.5% for each month or portion thereof during which the rent or fee remain unpaid.
9. BTC acknowledges with respect to the provisions of Section 6.5 that it has fully amortized its initial investment, that the City no longer has any reimbursement obligation and that the products of the initial investment belong to the City.
10. The parties hereto adopt and confirm all provisions of the original Concession Agreement effective as of May 1, 2017, except as amended herein.
11. This Concession Agreement, shall remain in effect until April 30, 2032 unless terminated.
12. This Concession Agreement is specifically conditioned on approval and ratification by the Broussard City Council.
